Car—free parking available all day at rear 26 Queen St, drive down the laneway, gate will be open.

Keynote Speaker

Tony Hughes-d'Aeth is Associate Professor of English and Cultural Studies at The University of Western Australia. He has published widely on Australian cultural history, including *Paper Nation: The Story of the Picturesque Atlas of Australasia, 1886-1888* (Melbourne University Press, 2001) which received the Ernest Scott and the W.K. Hancock prizes for Australian history. Tony is also a co-editor of *Westery* magazine, a literary journal devoted to Australian and Asian writing and culture. His research interests include film and media theory, as well as psychoanalysis. He is currently writing a literary history of the wheatbelt of Western Australia

Inspiring Story-Teller

Jenny McNae is recognised as one of Western Australia's leading theatre practitioners. She is a director, actor and tutor of theatre arts, was artistic director of the Hole in the Wall Theatre for 2 years and has worked with all WA's major theatre companies.

Jenny's 50 year professional career includes acting for film, TV and radio, choreography, writing and script development, adjudication and many artist-in-residencies.

She served on the Women's Advisory Council to the Premier and, as President, hosted the international conference Women in Sport and the Arts. She is currently a member of the Perth Theatre Trust.

Talented Organist

Graham Devenish, accomplished organist and musician, currently the talented organist at St Johns Fremantle. Graham was born to a musical family and after tertiary studies at UWA School of Music, he taught at private schools and has held positions as organist and musical director, playing expertly on magnificent pipe organs, some of which he has built himself!
